THE EVANGELISTIC ADVANTAGE OF MINISTRY TRAINING SCHOOLS

Training men and women in Australia is the best possible way to evangelise this great nation. Ministry training schools offer the following advantages:

1 . *Culturally relevant.* Cross-cultural missionaries must spend many hours learning and adjusting to a new culture. Training men and women in their own culture eliminates this problem.

2 . *Cost effective.* It is *ten times* more cost effective to train men and women in their own country than to bring in missionaries from another country.

3 . *Utilizes local resources and talent.* Australia is blessed with the wealth and talent which MSOBS will utilize to the glory of God and the expansion of His kingdom.

4 . *Increases local evangelism.* Experience shows church planting increases significantly when training schools are mobilised. Students from MSOBS make disciples and plant churches as part of their training.

5 . *Encourages men and women to stay and serve in their own country.* It is common for those who study/train in the United States to remain there after graduation. Local training avoids this problem.

6 . *Discourages dependence on foreign support.* Graduates of MSOBS will be encouraged to find and supply their own support instead of an unhealthy dependence on the “American dollar.” No foreign support is offered to graduates.

ABOUT THE STAFF

Each dean will focus on three major areas:

1. Saving the lost through Biblical Teaching.
2. Planting, establishing and sustaining healthy congregations.
3. Training gospel preachers and teachers.
